House Bill 1101 (Worcester County Delegation)
Government, Labor, and Elections

**Worcester County - Alcoholic Beverages - Temporary To-Go Event Permit and
Class C Per Diem Municipal To-Go Beer, Wine, and Liquor License**

This bill establishes, in Worcester County, a Class C per diem municipal to-go beer, wine, and liquor (BWL) license and a related temporary to-go event permit. The bill authorizes the Worcester County Board of License Commissioners to issue the license to municipalities in the county, and authorizes the license holder to allow beer, wine, and liquor sold by the holder of a temporary to-go event permit to enter a designated special event area described in the license for a period not exceeding seven consecutive days, as specified. The bill also authorizes the board to issue a to-go event permit to the holder to a Class B BWL six-day license or a Class B BWL seven-day license located within or immediately adjacent to a special event area identified in and for use in conjunction with a Class C per diem municipal to-go BWL license. The board must establish regulations for the license and permit, as specified. The fee for the Class C per diem municipal to-go BWL license is \$45 per day, and the fee for the temporary to-go event permit is \$20 per day. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2026.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Worcester County revenues increase, beginning in FY 2027, to the extent Class C per diem municipal to-go BWL licenses and temporary to-go event permits are issued. Worcester County can handle the monitoring of any additional licenses or permits issued using existing resources.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Bill Summary:

Class C Per Diem Municipal To-go License

The board must adopt regulations related to the issuance of and requirements for a Class C per diem municipal to-go BWL license, including regulations related to (1) the designation of a special event area; (2) the hours of sale; (3) age verification requirements; (4) the use of specified to-go cups; (5) advertising, posting of notice, and public hearing requirements for the license and any associated temporary to-go event permit; and (6) public safety and event security requirements.

Temporary To-go Event Permit

The temporary to-go event permit authorizes the holder to sell at retail beer, wine, and liquor in approved to-go cups that may be carried outside the licensed established of a Class B BWL six-day license or a Class B BWL seven-day license and into the designated special event area. The permit holder must be responsible for complying with all applicable laws and regulations.

The board must adopt regulations related to the issuance of and requirements for the permit, including regulations related to (1) the designation of a special event area; (2) the hours of sale; (3) age verification requirements; (4) the use of specified to-go cups; and (5) advertising, posting of notice, and public hearing requirements for the temporary to-go event permit.

Current Law: Generally, the Worcester County Board of License Commissioners is authorized to issue a Class B BWL six-day or seven-day license to hotels that meet specified room and seating requirements and to restaurants that meet specified seating requirements and have average daily receipts from the sale of food exceeding the average daily receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages, as specified. The annual fee is \$1,750 for a six-day license, and \$2,000 for a seven-day license.

Local Fiscal Effect: Worcester County revenues increase, beginning in fiscal 2027, to the extent the board issues Class C per diem municipal to-go BWL licenses and temporary to-go event permits. The number of municipalities that will apply for a license under the bill is unknown, and any related permits are dependent on where the license is issued and if any Class B BWL license holders choose to apply for a permit. Therefore, any potential increase in Worcester County license and permit fee revenues under the bill cannot be reliably estimated. Worcester County can handle the bill's requirements with existing resources.
