House Bill 1178

(Delegates Harrison and Toles)

Municipalities - Annexation - Limitations

This emergency bill prohibits a municipality from annexing land that is located in a different legislative district than a legislative district in which all or part of the municipality is located without first notifying the members of the General Assembly for the district in which the land is located. After an annexation resolution is introduced, the municipality must provide written notice via electronic communication and United States Postal Service to the members of the General Assembly for the district in which the land is located.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not materially affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: The bill does not materially affect local government operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: A municipality may enlarge its boundaries by annexation of land, subject to various criteria and procedures established in Title 4, Subtitle 4 of the Local Government Article, including adoption of an annexation plan (a plan for providing municipal services to the annexed area) and enactment of an annexation resolution.

The power of annexation applies only to land that is contiguous and adjoining to the existing boundaries of the municipality and does not create an unincorporated area that is bounded on all sides by: (1) real property presently in the boundaries of the municipality; (2) real property proposed to be in the boundaries of the municipality; or (3) any

combination of real property that is either presently or proposed to be in the boundaries of the municipality.

A municipality may not annex land that is in another municipality.
