Community Pathways Waiver - Adoption of Regulations

This bill requires the Secretary of Health to adopt regulations governing the Community Pathways waiver, including regulations pertaining to the delivery of self-directed services.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The Maryland Department of Health can promulgate regulations with existing budgeted resources. Revenues are affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) provides self-directed services through three special Medicaid waiver programs known as the Medicaid home- and community-based services programs, including the Family Supports, Community Supports, and Community Pathways waivers. Medicaid waiver programs allow states to make exceptions to specified rules and enable services to be provided in different settings that are tailored to individuals with different needs or varying income levels. For those who qualify, the waiver programs offer services within the community as an alternative to receiving services in an institution. Applicants must meet specific technical, medical, and financial criteria to receive services.

A participant in self-directed DDA services works with a coordinator of community services to identify needs and preferences and identify an allocated budget amount. A

participant develops a self-directed budget for services authorized in their person-centered plan. Participants then select staff or vendors and arrange for services and supports as authorized in the person-centered plan.

The [Self-Directed Services Manual](#), most recently updated on May 19, 2025, is for people who are interested in or currently self-directing their Medicaid waiver services.
