House Bill 664

(Cecil County Delegation)

Finance

Cecil County - Alcoholic Beverages - Alteration of License Quota

This bill alters the quota on the number of alcoholic beverages licenses that the Cecil County Board of License Commissioners may issue to apply *only* to Class A alcoholic beverages licenses. The board may not issue (1) in the aggregate, more than one Class A license for every 2,000 registered voters or major fraction in the county, as determined by the current registration of voters or (2) fewer than two Class A licenses in each election district of the county. The bill also specifies that no other class of license may be counted in the computation of the aggregate number of licenses. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2026.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill is not anticipated to materially affect Cecil County finances or operations.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Current Law: In Cecil County, the board may not issue more than one license for every 400 registered voters in the county, as determined by the current registration of voters. A Class BLX beer, wine, and liquor restaurant license, Class C club license, motel-restaurant complex license, hotel-restaurant complex license, or Class GC (golf course) beer, wine, and liquor (on-sale) license may not be counted in the computation of the aggregate number of licenses. The quota must be computed and applied separately for each election district of the county. Cecil County is divided into nine election districts.

Recent Prior Introductions: Similar legislation has not been introduced within the last three years.
