House Joint Resolution 2 (Delegate Wu, *et al.*)
Rules and Executive Nominations

United States of America - National Infrastructure Bank

This joint resolution urges the U.S. Congress to pass the National Infrastructure Bank Act, a bill that would create a \$5.0 trillion bank to generally facilitate the financing of infrastructure projects, including bringing the nation's infrastructure to a state of good repair and building new projects. The preamble notes that resolutions in support of the Act have been introduced or passed in 30 state legislatures, and the initiative has support from numerous national organizations and local elected bodies. The Department of Legislative Services must forward copies of the resolution to certain officials or entities.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The joint resolution does not directly affect State finances, as it only urges the U.S. Congress to take specific action.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Generally, Maryland's capital budget is critical to supporting infrastructure in the State. The Department of Budget and Management oversees the State capital program, which includes capital construction and improvement projects (excluding transportation), grant and loan programs administered by State agencies, and miscellaneous grants to local governments and nonprofit organizations. The program is currently supported by general obligation bonds authorized in the capital budget and pay-as-you-go funds appropriated in the operating budget. The Maryland Department of Transportation administers its own transportation program, and State universities have the authority to issue revenue bonds.
