**Natural Resources - Pamela J. Kelly Tree-Mendous Maryland Program -
Alterations**

This departmental bill alters the stated purpose of the Pamela J. Kelly Tree-Mendous Maryland Program – which, under current law, is focused on planting native trees and shrubs – to also focus on community participation and on stewardship (in addition to planting) of native trees and shrubs. The program’s altered purpose is promoting community participation in the planting and stewardship of native trees and shrubs through community forestry activities on public lands, community open spaces, school grounds, and rights-of-way.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill only alters the purposes for which existing donated/granted funds may be used. The expanded scope of the program under the bill may affect the timing of deployment of existing funds, but does not otherwise directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). The Department of Legislative Services concurs with this assessment. (The attached assessment does not reflect amendments to the bill.)

Analysis

Current Law: Chapter 129 of 2012 established the Pamela J. Kelly Tree-Mendous Maryland Program in statute for the purpose of planting native trees and shrubs on public lands, community open spaces, school grounds, and rights-of-way. The program is administered by DNR and funded by donations and grants received by the department. The department is authorized to seek, accept, and expend donations and grants for the implementation and administration of the program.

Background: DNR indicates that the bill improves the department's ability to deploy program funds, enabling the Maryland Forest Service to address forest management needs beyond planting and deliver a range of resources in support of statewide forest conservation.
