Senate Bill 229 (Senators Brooks and Gile)  
Education, Energy, and the Environment

---

**General Provisions – Commemorative Month – Maryland Native Plant Month**

---

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the month of May as Maryland Native Plant Month in recognition of the benefits that native plants have on Maryland’s natural environment. The proclamation must urge educational and environmental organizations and businesses to observe Maryland Native Plant Month properly with appropriate programs, events, and activities.

---

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. Commemorating Maryland Native Plant Month does not affect State finances.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

**Analysis**

**Current Law:** Twenty official commemorative days, seven months, and one week are recognized in State law, as shown in **Appendix – Official Commemorative Days and Months in Maryland**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.

“Native plant” is a plant that occurs naturally in the State and surrounding region, ecosystem, and habitat, without direct or indirect human actions. This includes a plant that

was present before colonial settlement or is listed as native to the State on the Maryland Plant Atlas website.
