Hospitals and Freestanding Birthing Centers - High-Risk Pregnancies -
Communication After Discharge

This bill requires a hospital or freestanding birthing center to *contact*, rather than call, the birthing parent following delivery after a high-risk pregnancy to evaluate the parent's status and, as necessary, provide information about postpartum complications. As under current law, this contact must be made at least 24 but no later than 48 hours after discharge.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The change is procedural in nature and does not directly affect governmental finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: If a newborn is delivered in a hospital or a freestanding birthing center following a high-risk pregnancy, the hospital or freestanding birther center must (1) complete a postpartum infant and maternal referral form and submit the form to the local health department where the birthing parent resides; (2) provide the birthing parent with resources and information specific to their circumstances, including information regarding the risks, signs, preventive measures, and treatment needs for postpartum complications, including cardiovascular conditions, chronic disease, substance misuse, and mental health conditions; and (3) call the birthing parent at least 24 hours, but not later than 48 hours, after discharging the parent to evaluate the parent's status and, as necessary, provide information about postpartum complications.
