**FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE**  
**Third Reader - Revised**

Senate Bill 418

(Senator Simonaire)

Education, Energy, and the Environment and  
 Finance

Economic Matters and Health

**Professional Licensing Portability - Members of the Foreign Service and Spouses**

This bill explicitly authorizes a Foreign Service member or a Foreign Service member’s spouse who relocates to the State due to an assignment or detail to the State and holds a license issued by another state to practice under that license for the duration of the assignment or detail within Maryland if the individual provides specified documentation and satisfies other criteria. If a Foreign Service member or spouse is authorized to practice under the bill’s provisions, the individual may practice only in the discipline and scope of practice allowed by the license in the other state, and the licensing authority in the State may not require another license unless the individual seeks to practice outside of the authorized discipline or scope of practice. A Foreign Service member or spouse authorized to practice under the bill (1) may practice to the same extent and capacity as an individual licensed in the State, including supervision of a licensed individual required to practice under supervision, and (2) is subject to the same disciplinary authority as an individual licensed in the State. Each licensing authority may adopt regulations to carry out the bill. The bill also makes conforming changes.

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** General and special fund expenditures may increase in FY 2027 for updates to licensing systems, as discussed below. General and special fund revenues may decrease indeterminately beginning in FY 2027 due to reduced license fee revenue, as discussed below.

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## Analysis

### Bill Summary/Current Law:

#### *Authorization to Practice Under the Bill for Foreign Service Members and Spouses*

*Definitions:* “Member of the Foreign Service” means an individual who is employed in the Foreign Service of the United States. “Licensing authority” means an agency of the State that issues a license. “License” means a license, permit, certification, registration, or other legal authorization required for engaging in an occupation or a profession.

*Application Process:* A member of the Foreign Service or spouse must:

- provide the licensing authority with a copy of the notification of assignment or detail;
- remain in good standing with (1) the regulatory authority that issued the initial license and (2) all states in which the applicant holds or has held a license of similar scope of practice and in the same discipline;
- have actively used the license within the two years immediately preceding relocation; and
- comply with the standards of practice, discipline, and fulfillment of any continuing education requirements required by the licensing authority in Maryland.

#### *Authorizations and Licensure – In General*

Generally, under current law, an individual must be licensed by the appropriate licensing authority before practicing specified occupations in the State. For certain occupations, there are pathways to practicing in Maryland more readily, including through interstate compacts, licensure by reciprocity, and expedited licensure for veterans.

Licensing compacts are legally binding agreements between two or more states that allow providers licensed in one state to practice in another state without requiring an additional license. As of November 2025, the State has entered eight health occupations licensing compacts: the Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Interstate Compact; the Nurse Licensure Compact; the Interstate Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact; the Interstate Physical Therapy Licensure Compact; the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact; the

Counseling Compact; the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact; and the Social Work Licensure Compact.

Section 1-704 of the Health Occupations Article requires each health occupations board to expedite the licensure, certification, or registration of an active service member, eligible veteran, or eligible spouse. Moreover, a board must assign to each such applicant an advisor to assist with the application process. If an active service member, eligible veteran, or eligible spouse meets the requirements for licensure, certification, or registration, a board must issue the license, certificate, or registration within 15 business days after receiving a completed application. If a board determines that an active service member, eligible veteran, or eligible spouse does not meet the education, training, or experience requirements for licensure, certification, or registration, a representative of the board must assist the applicant in identifying programs that offer relevant education or training or ways of obtaining needed experience. Section 2.5-106 of the Business Regulation Article, Section 6-101.1 of the Education Article, and Section 11-612.2 of the Financial Institutions Article contain similar provisions for other licenses, including educator and mortgage loan originator licenses.

The bill does not apply to an occupation or profession for which an individual may practice in the State under an interstate compact or to the practice of law. Additionally, although the Board of Architects offers licensure by reciprocity, an individual authorized to practice architecture in the State under the bill may not be required to apply for a license by reciprocity.

*Miscellaneous*

Under current law, the Automotive Safety Enforcement Division of the Department of State Police must administer an examination to each inspection mechanic applicant. The bill alters that provision such that an individual authorized to conduct vehicle inspections under the bill must not be required to take the examination.

*Servicemembers Civil Relief Act*

Recent changes to the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) allow for professional license portability for Foreign Service members and the spouses of Foreign Service members. In general, the provisions in the federal law regarding the application process mirror the procedures established in the bill.

**State Fiscal Effect:** As discussed below, certain licensing authorities in the State anticipate additional expenditures for programming changes to implement the bill, in addition to potential reduced revenues from licensing fees. The Department of Legislative Services advises, however, that because many of the changes in the bill codify SCRA, some of these fiscal effects may not be directly attributable to the bill, but instead to federal requirements.

*Maryland Department of Agriculture*

The Maryland Department of Agriculture advises that most of the licenses for which the bill applies already have no-fee interstate reciprocity, with the exception of veterinarians. The State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (SBVME) estimates that no more than 10 Foreign Service members and/or spouses will seek licensure as a veterinarian under the bill, and current license fees are \$300 annually. Therefore, special fund revenues may decrease by up to \$3,000 on an annual basis.

SBVME advises that the bill may require modifications to its licensure software to accommodate the new authorization. Based on an estimate from similar projects, special fund expenditures may increase by at least \$15,000 in fiscal 2027 for a one-time software update.

### *Maryland State Department of Education*

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) advises that it requires updates to the teacher licensure platform to create an alternate authorization process for Foreign Service members and their spouses eligible under the bill; thus, MSDE general fund expenditures may increase by up to \$30,000 in fiscal 2027 only.

### *Judiciary*

The Judiciary advises that certain business licenses are issued by the clerks of the circuit courts, with license fee revenues subsequently distributed to the general fund and the municipal corporation/county where the licensed business is located, as further specified in statute. To the extent that licensing fees are not collected due to the bill's authorization process, State general fund revenues and revenues to local jurisdictions are reduced.

### *Other Agencies*

Other agencies impacted by the bill's changes generally anticipate being able to implement the bill using existing budgeted resources. State revenues associated with other licenses are anticipated to decrease, likely only minimally, to the extent that individuals take advantage of the special procedures under the bill to practice under licenses issued in other states.

**Small Business Effect:** Some Foreign Service members and their spouses who require professional licenses to work for certain small businesses in the State may benefit from the authorization process under the bill. Small business employers may similarly benefit. However, any meaningful benefit is likely attributable to the federal changes to SCRA.

**Additional Comments:** As of September 2024, there are an estimated 14,400 Foreign Service employees in the United States.
