AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 791
(Third Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, at the top of the page, insert "EMERGENCY BILL"; in line 2, strike "**Public Safety**" and substitute "**Criminal Procedure**"; in line 8, after "exceptions;" insert "prohibiting State and local correctional facilities from taking certain actions against an individual based on a certain immigration status of the individual or any other person;".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, in line 19, strike "COVERED" and substitute "CONVICTED".

On page 3, in line 19, strike "(IV), AND (V)" and substitute "AND (IV)"; and in line 20, strike "COVERED" and substitute "CONVICTED".

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 4, in line 7, after the semicolon insert "OR"; strike beginning with the semicolon in line 9 down through "**PERSON**" in line 12.

On page 5, after line 7, insert:

"(D) A STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY OR A LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITY MAY NOT COERCE, INTIMIDATE, OR THREATEN AN INDIVIDUAL BASED ON THE ACTUAL OR PERCEIVED CITIZENSHIP OR IMMIGRATION STATUS OF THE INDIVIDUAL OR ANY OTHER PERSON.";

and in line 8, strike "(D)" and substitute "(E)".

Page 2 of 2

On page 8, strike in their entirety lines 21 and 22 and substitute:

“SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if any provision of this Act or the application of any provision of this Act to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.”.
